A Vital Ministry

June 24th Terry Miller, former AB Women's Ministries of MA Coordinator of Personal Development and Coordinator of Love Gift, posted a plea for help on Facebook asking if any American Baptist women living in Billings, Montana could reach out to her friend, Alberta, whose son was attacked, badly beaten and lying in a coma in the hospital. That same day Barbara Anderson, former national AB Women's Ministries president and president of AB Women's Ministries of Massachusetts, responded and connected Terry to Pam Davies, former president of AB Women's Ministries of Montana. In Terry's words read how AB women came together for someone in need.

When your daughter calls you and says, "MOM, I need your help!" What do you do? "Wayne's nephew is in great trouble and he needs a lot of prayer." "Mom, can you call your friends from the churches and ask them to pray for him?"

Raymond, a young 24-year-old, was badly beaten and was airlifted from South Dakota to Billings, Montana along with his mother. As his mother sat by his side each day alone in Billings, she began to run out of money. Her brother Wayne joined her in Billings, Montana but he too was running out of money.

My daughter asked, "Mom, do you know anyone who can help them?" "They need help Mom!"

God had his hand all over this story...in so many ways.

(Matthew 7:7) "Ask and it will be given to you, seek and you shall find."

I reached out to Barbara Anderson, past president of AB Women's Ministries of Massachusetts, and she connected me to Pam Davies in Billings, Montana. Pam Davies contacted her church and they went together to assist Wayne and his sister Alberta. They brought food, prayer, and hope. And God even brought them a Native American woman/AB woman named Dolly Notafraid from Billings Baptist Church, who would be able to understand their culture and reach out to them in ways that we would not have known ourselves. They watched and prayed over Raymond and we asked for a miracle. Raymond lay in a coma for about 4 weeks. While God worked his miracles, we continued to pray for Raymond. Doctors were not giving us hope. During this time, Alberta and Wayne had run out of money.

(Proverbs 3:27) "Do not withhold good from those to whom it is due, when it is in your power to act."

When money totally ran out for both Wayne and Alberta and they were no longer able to pay for their motel room, someone generously donated \$1,000.00 to Wayne from his place of business. Also, when Alberta needed to leave and return home to take care of important business, along with two

grandchildren left behind to her from her daughter who was killed in a car accident about two months before Raymond was beaten, a GoFundMe page was able to raise the funds that she needed.

(Job 5:8-9) "But if I were you, I would appeal to God, I would lay my cause before him. He performs wonders that cannot be fathomed, miracles that cannot be counted."

While Wayne and Alberta have left Billings, Montana, our American Baptist support continued to visit and pray over Raymond, and as they did they witnessed themselves God's miracle.

(Ephesians 3:20-21) "Now to him who is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine, according to his power that is at work within us. To him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus throughout all generations, for ever and ever! Amen."

Within a week, Raymond was out of his coma, talking, and even walking. The Pastor at Billings First Baptist Church told Pam that Raymond had accepted Jesus into his life.

Raymond has since been transferred to another state for rehabilitation. Now that Raymond is out of his coma and able to identify his perpetrators, the police are involved, and information is scarce. We continue to keep Alberta in prayer and Raymond as his road is long and hard ahead of him.

I personally cannot thank AB women enough for all their support, beginning with Barbara Anderson, who has been an amazing sister to me since the day I met her, and Pam Davies for bringing the situation to her church and responding not only with all the right people needed, but continuous caring and prayer and concern for Raymond, Wayne and Alberta.

When I asked Wayne and Alberta did they have anything they wanted me to say, they just said to especially thank Pam Davies, Dolly Notafraid, and for all the prayer for Raymond.

Through this situation I saw so much of God's work: AB women connecting from state-to-state, the power of prayer, the generosity of so many, and then God's miracle for Raymond.

(Philippians 4:6-7) "Don't be anxious about anything, rather bring up all your request to God in your prayers and petitions, along with giving thanks. Then the peace of God that exceeds all understanding will keep your hearts and minds safe in Christ Jesus."

As you can see AB Women's Ministries is a vital ministry. We are united across the United States and Puerto Rico through AB Women's Ministries as "a community of passionately faithful, mission-minded women and girls engaged in worship, service, and friendship."

Mission and Service

I continue to share my experience leading a mission team to Puerto Rico last April. Our 12-member team worked alongside a team from West Virginia rebuilding a church that was damaged during Hurricane Maria. As you most likely know from media reports, there is still so much work to do to help that community regain their homes, churches, and schools.

During the Tri-State AB Women's Ministries conference, many of you showed interest in being part of an AB women's team. I have followed up with Abigail Medina Betancourt, who is the Puerto Rico Volunteer Coordinator for American Baptist Home Mission Society (ABHMS).

As of now, the registration cost for a trip through them is \$150. That covers housing and food. Abigail did say that might increase by next year. Additional costs include transportation in PR and round-trip airfare. Being a teacher, I did ask about the possibility of working in a school for a week after hearing an NPR story on the recent status of schools.

Right now, I am looking at the 3rd week of June 2019 for an AB Women's Ministries of MA mission trip to PR. At this point, I am sending out 'feelers' to see how much interest there is in putting a team together. White Cross



The picture to the left shows the items donated by the congregation at the First Baptist Church in Hanson for 2017-2018 during their "Christmas in July" mission event for White Cross. Over 350 items were given to the Massachusetts Baptist Multicultural Ministries (MBMM) and EVERYONE participated.

Your church's 2017-2018 giving and your White Cross reports should have already been sent or delivered to MBMM and your report to your association's White Cross coordinator. If you need a report form, contact the White Cross coordinator in your association or if you are not sure who your association's coordinator is contact me. Put in the subject line "White Cross Question." Make sure to send your reports in ASAP. Note the reports cover the American Baptist Home Mission Society (ABHMS/Overland) aspect of your giving to White Cross.

International Ministries (IM) goal of monetary donations for Massachusetts in 2017-2018 was \$10,000. The donations should be in by September 30, 2018. If you haven't made your donation, check your White Cross packet of information you received from your White Cross association coordinator. Your gifts will help purchase medical supplies for hospitals and clinics, educational materials for Christian centers and after school and adult programs, food, clothing, and baby items for families OR you may give to a particular "Focus Area" that your Church is passionate about such as Education, Health or Human Trafficking. By giving to a "Focus Area" your monetary gift will be divided equally amongst the missions that concern themselves with these specific "Focus Areas." YOU MAY GIVE ONLINE: <https://portal.internationalministries.org/project-support>. Under "I would like to support" section select any of the projects beginning with "White Cross..." under the sentence "For churches: If this donation is being made by a church (not by an individual), enter the church name, city and state. The tax receipt will be sent to this church" enter the information requested. Thank you!

2018-2019 The packets should be arriving to you sometime in September. The year starts October 1, 2018 and goes through 9/30/2019 for IM and 5/31/2019 for ABHMS. ABHMS will again be for MBMM and International Ministries (IM) monetary donations for Massachusetts in 2018-2019 is \$7,500. Your association coordinator should know what percent of the total your Church may give as part of the total state's request.

If your Church doesn't have an active women's group or is not involved with White Cross, let your pastor or missions committee know that you volunteer to coordinate this wonderful mission. Contact your White Cross association coordinator or contact me and I will get your information to your association's coordinator to send you a packet for 2018-2019. 2018/2019 Mission Focus Theme: Domestic Violence

Domestic violence is violence or other abuse by one person against another in a domestic setting, such as in marriage or cohabitation. It may be termed intimate partner violence when committed by a spouse or partner in an intimate relationship against the other spouse or partner, and can take place in heterosexual or same-sex relationships, or between former spouses or partners. Domestic violence can also involve violence against children, parents, or the elderly. It takes a number of forms, including physical, verbal, emotional, economic, religious, reproductive, and sexual abuse, which can range from subtle, coercive forms to marital rape and to violent physical abuse such as choking, beating, female genital mutilation, and acid throwing that results in disfigurement or death. Domestic murders include stoning, bride burning, honor killings, and dowry deaths. (Wikipedia)

The statistics on domestic violence are heartbreaking. 1 in 3 women and 1 in 5 men have experienced some form of physical or sexual violence or stalking at the hands of an intimate partner. Over half of women and men who have experienced some form of domestic violence were victimized for the first time before they were 25 years old. A representative from Interfaith Partnership Against Domestic Violence (IPADV) spoke at our AB Women's Ministries Breakfast Buffet this past May.
