### Stay Connected to the Vine


*"<sup>5</sup>I am the vine; you are the branches. If you remain in me and I in you, you will bear much fruit; apart from me you can do nothing. <sup>6</sup>If you do not remain in me, you are like a branch that is thrown away and withers; such branches are picked up, thrown into the fire and burned." John 15:5-6*

While contemplating this scripture the thought of how it relates to AB Women's Ministries and myself came to me. I might be stretching it a bit, but it makes sense to me hopefully in a respectful way.

If you look at the diagram below starting from the bottom up, the root system is the national AB Women's Ministries, our state's AB Women's Ministries is the vine, the associations' women's ministries are the branches and the fruit is the local women's groups or individual women in the local churches. That said, it is through the roots that water, nutrients and minerals provided by God are taken in. But, if the roots are dug up, then life will end. If you take a branch off from the vine or a piece of fruit off the branch and leave it by itself, it will eventually wither away and die.

A little over 20 years ago my pastor's wife, Rev. Ana Higbee-Barzola, invited the president of AB Women's Ministries of MA, Stella Ordonez, to come to our church to speak to the women about AB Women's Ministries. Shortly after that the women decided to start a women's group. A few years later some of us began attending women's ministries events in the association, state and national. Although the women in my church don't meet on a regular basis now, I continue to stay connected with the ABC women's ministries family. The women are encouraging, supportive and they are a lot of fun to be with. It is because of women's ministries that I found my voice, developed leadership skills, grew spiritually, and grew as an individual.

Women's ministries is a vehicle that allows God's love to flow through in its fellowship, workshops, worship, singing, learning experiences, etc. Make the choice to stay among the branches connected to the vine rather than cut yourselves off because God wants us to prosper and grow to be the best fruit we possibly can.

## Treasurer

AB Women's Ministries of MA is engaged in all-important mission with women and girls. One, The Eight Steps of Giving, is received on a yearly basis and is due May 15<sup>th</sup>. Your support as an individual or through your women's group or mission board is greatly appreciated. The purpose of the Eight Steps of Giving is:

1. **Scholarships**—undergraduate and graduate scholarships are awarded to American Baptist women in our eight associations, who qualify, assisting them in furthering their education.
2. **Camperships**—campers attending Oceanwood and Grotonwood.
3. **State Project**—each year a worthy cause is chosen. This year's project is a local mission, the Christian Youth Conference. Next year's state project is an international project, Christian women in Angola, which was voted on at the 2018 Spring Conference annual meeting.

4. **State Support**—contributions to AB Women's Ministries of MA provides funds for regional and operating expenses.
5. **AB GIRLS**—this ministry is for girls in grades 3 through 12. These girls are a part of our present and are our future. We endeavor to provide support in building relationships, encouraging leadership and developing skills.
6. **Friendship Fund**—provides women and girls with scholarship assistance to attend events held by our organization.
7. **Women and Girls Mission Fund**—supports AB Women's Ministries ABCUSA missions at home and around the world.
8. **White Cross**—when urgently needed supplies are provided by women's groups, churches or individuals that are requested from mission workers overland (American Baptist Home Mission Society) and overseas (International Ministries) this completes the step.

The importance of White Cross is immeasurable, and 2019 marks 100 years of your labor and generosity! Thank you for your loving commitment in meeting needs by supporting mission around the world. Through God's grace, this critical ministry continues to bless those who give, those who serve and those who receive.

An important change noted in the 2019-2020 request: ROLLED BANDAGES WRAP-UP

AB Women's Ministries of MA and International Ministries (IM) wish to thank the women and girls in the local churches for their faithful hands that have rolled bandages over the past 100 years! Thanks to your commitment, this need has been met. IM is continuing to ship out boxes of rolled bandages, and it may take up to four more years to use up what is stored. IM global servant, Katherine Niles and international partners in the D.R. of Congo are discontinuing use of handmade bandages. Thank you again for being part of this meaningful ministry.

If you have any bandages that you are rolling now, please send what you have made before **September 30, 2019**. IM will continue to ship what they have received until supply is depleted. After October 1, 2019, only baby kits should be sent to the Brethren Service Center. Also, they state that "Although rolled bandages are wrapping up and shipping out, there is an ongoing need for baby items." You can assemble the kits or send a financial gift to purchase the needed baby and medical supplies for new moms. Only include the items listed on the instruction sheets.
